UASI Overview

Urban Areas Security Initiative


The Federal Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) program assists high-threat, high-density urban areas in building and sustaining the capabilities necessary to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism.

- Homeland Security Grant Program (DHS FEMA) funding
- California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) applies for and receives UASI grant for entire state
- 6 UASIs in CA, including the Bay Area - each manages its own regional program to address unique security needs and enhance preparedness



Bay Area UASI Overview

- Twelve (12) operational areas/ counties
- Three (3) Core Cities:
San Francisco, Oakland, San Jose
- Four (4) Hubs
- Bay Area UASI Management Team
- Approval Authority (board)
- CCSF is fiscal sponsor of UASI grant





FY26 Performance Period

» **Tentative Start Date:**

November 1, 2026

» **Tentative End Date:**

December 31, 2027



Circumstances Impacting FY26



Currently unknown how much HSGP funding will go to Bay Area

- ! DHS FY26 federal budget has not been passed
- ! President's budget proposed 25% cut in UASI funding nationwide, 25% match requirement, 1 year performance period, new DHS terms and conditions
- ! House and Senate bills removed these requirements and restore funding levels to FY23 amounts



Harder to predict future awards with confidence than in the past

- ! Still unsure about FY25 award details
- ! Don't know when FY26 NOFO will be released (major delays with FY25 NOFO)
- ! State and local lawsuits

FY26 Kickoff delayed due to lack of concrete information from DHS/FEMA and CalOES



FY26 Bay Area UASI Funding

This year, UASI grant funds will be split into three separate “buckets” that you may apply for:

- 1. Core City** (Oakland, San Francisco and San Jose only)
- 2. Hub** (East, North, South and West)
- 3. National Priority Area Project** - new option!



All grant-funded projects must fall within:

Planning | Organization | Equipment | Training | Exercise

Projects must benefit at least (2) two operational areas

Planning	<p>Covers a wide range of community preparedness & emergency management activities</p> <p>Examples: The development, review, or revision of THIRA, SPR, or continuity of operations plans. Consultants / contractors allowed.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Positions are limited to a maximum of 14 months for each grant year.▪ Each position must include a specific deliverable that clearly ties to a Homeland Security Goal Area▪ Each position must be submitted individually as a project with its own proposal.
Organization	<p>Personnel / Staff / Teams</p> <p>Examples: Program management or operational support; development of regional partnerships; structures and mechanisms for information sharing between the public and private sector; salaries and benefits for intelligence analyst personnel</p>	
Equipment	<p>Covers a wide range of public safety equipment – must be an allowable cost with an Authorized Equipment # and often has compliance requirements. Equipment purchases that do not require compliance approval can happen much easier/faster!</p> <p>All equipment should be competitively bid unless below micro-threshold.</p> <p>Piggybacking is allowed.</p> <p>Examples: Bomb squad suits; interoperable communications equipment; vision/hearing protection; trailers, etc</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Noncompetitive procurement approval required by CalOES for any equipment over \$250K that receives only one bid or is only produced by a single source▪ Include shipping and taxes▪ Performance bonds required for any piece of equipment over \$250K AND for any vehicles, watercraft or aircraft regardless of cost▪ Environmental and Historic Preservation requirements (EHP) for any installed equipment (not for portable)▪ Controlled Equipment? Work with Bay Area UASI Compliance Team
Training	<p>Builds capabilities of personnel across various disciplines (law enforcement, fire, emergency management, etc.) to have the necessary skills and knowledge to perform their roles during an emergency or terrorist event – can be classroom-based or field-based.</p> <p>Examples: Terrorism Liaison Officer (TLO) training; Intelligence analyst training; Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training; Public information and warning system training; Cybersecurity training</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Feedback # from CSTI required for every training▪ Clear connection to closing capability gaps or sustaining existing capabilities identified through the jurisdiction's THIRA and SPR process.▪ Noncompetitive procurement approval required by CalOES for any trainings that receive only one vendor bid, regardless of cost▪ Documentation is important (sign-in sheets, flyer with dates/times, training agenda, etc)▪ EHP approval from CalOES required for field-based trainings
Exercise	<p>Activities that simulate real-world scenarios to test and improve emergency response plans and capabilities – can be table-top or field-based. Exercises allow jurisdictions to: validate strategies and procedures outlined in their plans; practice roles and responsibilities in a controlled environment; identify gaps before an actual incident occurs; and collaborate among various agencies.</p> <p>Examples: Active Assailant (tabletop and field-based); Supply Chain Challenges; Earthquake scenario</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Noncompetitive approval authorizations required for exercises over \$250K that received only one bid▪ EHP approval from CalOES required for field-based trainings▪ Must adhere to the Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) guidance.



FY26 Application Process

- Retiring the 2-year grant application cycle - back to 1 year only
- Applications will be accepted for a **3-week** period
- When FY26 NOFO is released, we will have to adjust accordingly and quickly
- Applicants may now submit project proposals for **National Priority Area projects**, as well as **Training & Exercise projects**
- Submit a separate application for each project
 - each position must be submitted as a separate application
 - don't include more than one POETE category in the same application



Developing your Project

Give the project a clear title!

"SFFD Night Vision Eyewear" or

"Santa Clara Emergency Planner III position"

Be descriptive, but brief

no more than two to three sentences.

- **Who** does the project benefit?
city/county fire department | bomb squad
- **What** does the project entail?
develop plans | purchase equipment | hire staff
- **When** will you be working on this project?
- **Where** is your jurisdiction?
- **Why** is this project needed?





Compliance

NCPA, EHP, Aircraft or Watercraft Approval?

Determine these requirements early!

- » Cal OES NCPA approval is only required if the **equipment** cost is over \$250k. Otherwise, follow jurisdiction regulation.
- » All noncompetitively bid **trainings** require NCPA approval, regardless of cost (**if only one bid is received**)
- » Performance bonds are REQUIRED to purchase any **item** over \$250k. All vehicles, aircraft and vessels need performance bonds as well. In some instances a performance bond waiver can be obtained.

Application Checklist

- You are a local government agency located within one of the 12 Bay Area counties
- You have received department head approval on application
- The person submitting the proposal is the project lead
- Follows the FY26 Proposal Guidance; attended Kick-off Meeting
- Describes a clear "nexus to terrorism"
- Project will supplement existing funds and not supplant funds that are appropriated for the same purpose
- Links to a Homeland Security Goal Area and Core Capabilities
- Benefits at least two operational areas
- Includes allowable expenses under UASI grant guidelines
- Each project has its own application
- Click "SUBMIT" after all forms have been "marked as completed"
