A step-by-step guide to creating your account and accessing your course on the Moonshot learning platform.

1 Go to the Moonshot Training Website

Open your web browser and go to:

moonshot-training.tovuti.io

2 Create Your Account

On the login page, click **Create an Account** or **Register**. You will be taken to the Account Registration form.

Fill in all required fields (marked with an asterisk *):

- **First Name** and **Last Name**
- **Email address** — use the email you check regularly
- **Username** and **Password** of your choice
- **Title** (e.g., Male, Female, Nonbinary, N/A)
- **Mobile Phone, Job Title, and Organization/Agency/Institution Name**
- **Country** and **State**
- Whether you are a **licensed or credentialed mental health provider** — if yes, provide your license type, licensing state, and license number; if no, enter N/A

You may also fill in optional fields: Preferred Name, how long you've been in your profession, prior violence prevention training experience, and how you heard about the course.
